MISSION MINISTRY

MISSIONS WATCH: Hurricane Relief This fall, Community Church will use the hurricane relief fund to assist victims of Hurricanes Maria, Florence, and Michael. \$10k worth of hard goods will be sent on a truck leaving Vero Beach next week to provide immediate relief in the Florida Panhandle. \$6k will be sent to the Harrelson Center in Wilmington, NC as they work with agencies and volunteers to recover from Hurricane Florence. And \$9k will be used to support our youth mission trip that will serve in Puerto Rico in June. We will also send \$10k to the Disaster Relief Fund of the United Church of Christ who will provide long term assistance, helping families restore or rebuild their homes. Any remaining funds will be channeled to churches that need help meeting deductibles or making repairs so that they can continue their much-needed ministries in their communities. Community Church Hurricane Relief donations are helping with both immediate and long term recovery throughout the southeast.

GLOBAL PRAYER PARTNER: Ecuador. Marilyn Cooper serves with Ecumenical Foundation for Development, Integration, Training and Education (FEDICE) in Ecuador. FEDICE helps give a better life to those in communities who are willing to learn new skills and to work together to make their communities better. Our work brings hope both now and for the future: Better nutrition, better education, healthier families. **Prayer**: Oh Lord, this life can be tough. You know that. Your Son experienced it. We pray today for beggars from Venezuela, jugglers and buskers from Colombia, women without resources to care for their families, little children who care for their younger siblings, youth who cannot find jobs, borrowers who cannot pay their debts, dogs too weak to search for food. They too know that life can be tough, and we pray for them to experience a taste of justice, a taste of resurrection. Amen.
